Hello everyone. To those I've yet to shake hands with, my name is Vanessa. Unlike everyone here, I've only known Nancy long enough to care for her leading up to her passing. But even as a mere CNA by her side the past few weeks, I can easily validate why you sit here today in celebrating her life.

Before I was given this particular assignment, Nancy was briefly described to me as “very direct, she knows what she wants, and can be verbally harsh, so be careful”. I've had similar types of cases introduced to me this way before, so from experience, I knew Nancy and I would get along just fine.

Nancy was surely direct. She directed.. my every move. She told you when to do something, how to do it, and if you missed it the first time, you were better off lighting a fire under your butt, or Nancy will. It took a few days for me to get used to her mannerisms of doing things exactly how she wanted you to. That if you knew it a certain way from her way, say goodbye to your way. It was for your own good.

Nancy definitely knew what she wanted. It reaffirmed me that being as picky as I am too was okay. She would tell you, “you're your own boss, don't let nobody tell you what to do”, the irony was a bit comical given Nancy was mine. Nonetheless, I knew her good intentions, why I always appreciated the value of her words because I knew she was giving them away with love.

Lastly, Nancy was verbally harsh. Not all the time, but enough that I found it to be just hilariously forgiving. She would acknowledge it too, saying on some days, “I'm trying to be nice but you don't listen”. In other words, if she was being harsh, it was your fault. You just couldn't get mad at her for being funny, but also telling it like it was. If you thought it, Nancy said it for you. So it wasn't necessarily that she was capable of being “verbally harsh”, she was just ‘keepin it

real', and in my book, that was true friendship, and that's all Nancy knew to be.

I've read somewhere that 'people come in and out of your life for a reason, a season, or a lifetime', Nancy was undoubtedly so in each of our lives. My prayer was always my gratitude... that God entrusted me to her care for a reason. Despite a short season of our fellowship, Nancy showed me a glimpse of her lifetime. You knew from the faces that visited her daily, the phone calls from family that excited her, the pictures of her nieces, nephews that she spoke so fondly of, how much she was dearly loved.

I've witnessed her give so selflessly, like when she had her sister Linda go buy notebooks and journals for her just to pass them out to the little ones who came by. She was always trying to feed you, give you something of hers to take home like her coupons in the mail, tipping you of where to go for good deals, that if you went anywhere other than the dollar store you're an idiot, and always making sure you were comfortable where you sat.

But even with all the love that surrounded her, I've also witnessed the times when she cried feeling like a burden, or from the pain she was enduring through the days. And it would hurt your heart because there wasn't much you could do but to hug her and pray over her, which she always appreciated. Although she was a tough cookie, fierce in her own right, through her tears she showed us her vulnerability. You see, being vulnerable is a strength, because we're exposed. Being exposed, you become free. In an odd sense, such gives you peace. So in her last few days, I believe Nancy stuck around longer because she was a fighter for the love that engulfed her.. but it was also her vulnerability that allowed her to go in peace, and be free.

I'll definitely miss you Nancy...

May she always live in the memories we exchange. Til we laugh with her again, may she rest in continuous love..
